



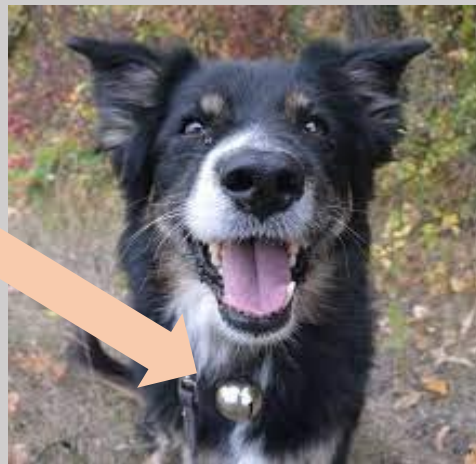
Camping with dogs



Camping is a great way to bond with your dog in an environment you both love, even though dogs are animals and “SHOULD” be used to being in nature, that’s not always the case. Even if your dog is outside a lot, camping is a different environment for them. Here are some tools to have with you and your dog to make it a wonderful experience.

What you Need to Bring:

- Lots of fresh water: Never let your dog drink from still water (lakes or ponds), they have deadly bacteria.
- Bear bell helps keep bears away from your camp and helps to know where your dog is while hiking.
- Sensory toys: Exercise – Food puzzles can provide exercise for your dog’s mind, and body, and relieve boredom.
- 30 ft. long line attached to a harness: keeps the dog at camp while setting up and breaking down.
- First aid kit
- Resealable dog food bins/bags: to help keep unwanted animals away.
- Tick key: Helps remove ticks while keeping them contained until properly disposed of.
- Dog Kennel: for shelter and a safe place for them to sleep.
- Lots of Toys.
