### Loose-Leash Walking

#### Steps



- 1. Stock your pocket/pouch with a dog's favorite treats. This is a difficult behavior for most dogs to learn, so use the highest-value treats. Put a harness or collar and a 6-foot standard leash on the dog. Go to a distraction-free quiet area the dog is comfortable in. Hold the end of the leash and ask the dog to Sit and Focus.
- 2. With your dog's attention place a treat on the floor, by your left heel, once your dog eats it say, "Let's go" and start walking.
- 3. Encourage her to take two or three steps with no tension on the leash and say "yes" followed by a reward.
  - Continue to practice this exercise until the dog walks without pulling for 10 steps 90 percent of the time. At this point, you begin to walk a dog without her being lured.
- 4. If she starts to pull, stop walking forward. (you also may need to take steps backward too) Wait for her to release pressure from the leash, then say "yes" followed by a reward, on the ground behind your heel. Continue walking, stopping, and rewarding for a loose leash.
- 5. Practice this exercise until the dog is walking with the leash resembling a "J" (shown below) for 10 or

Hand signal: pat your hip on the side you want the dog to start walking on.

Verbal Cue: "Let's go" "Walk"

# Troubleshoot "J" walking

When your dog doesn't want to walk: Mention this to your vet so they can examine if there is any medical reason your dog doesn't want to walk.

- 1. Drop treats in front of you to encourage your dog to walk.
- 2. periodically toss a couple into some grass to make walks more fun!

Bring the Walk Home: Find sticks, leaves, or anything your dog likes to smell in your neighborhood and place them around your yard for your dog to enjoy.



# Troubleshoot "J" walking:

#### When your dog starts to pull towards smell:

- 1. Stop walking you may even have to get into your dog's line of sight to coax your dog to come to you, once they do ask them to perform cues: (sit, down, focus)
- 2. Once they perfume the cue release them to smell the smell as their reward.
